Second Phase of pilot training course

Italy

After the adjustments made following the suggestions of students and teachers gathered during the first testing phase, students were recruited through social media and Eurocultura's information channels. The success was sensational, 112 students have enrolled for the course "General", 29 for "Care" and 41 for "Tourism".

Greece

In Greece, about 30 participants had attended the second phase. All of them are vocational students from the sector "Care" or "Tourism". About 10 of them were disabled persons.

Spain

Around 90 Spanish students participated in the first and second experimentation phase in the three different courses. The course has reached even more students thanks to the Facebook page of the Fundación Docete Omnes. The courses are having an excellent reception in Spain and new students are registering in the courses every day.
