Check out the RSI game for students!

The new website containing the Ready Steady Internship 'game' is launched! To find an internship that matches your students skills and expertise, students can create an account and enter the 'Ready' part of the platform. This section of the website gives students an impression of internship possibilities in several sectors. What sector suits their interest best? Once a student has registered to the platform and studied the different sectors available, the student can enter the short self-assessment course. If all questions are answered correctly, the second section of the website opens up: the 'Steady' section.

The 'Steady' section includes practical, easy to use tips and tools students can use to prepare their internship. Again, after students have studied this section and correctly answered the short Multiple choice assessment, the third section of the site opens up: the 'Internship' section. This section shows the offer of companies involved in the RSI project and the internships they offer. Students can search and find an internship that matches their interests and skills and save the company cards. The company cards include a description of the company and the internship it offers.

The project meeting in Angouleme was an important moment for the partners to discuss re-distribution of tasks, rescheduling of planning etc. In spite of this unfortunate event, all partners joined forces and activated their network in Germany to make sure the project will not get jeopardized. National tasks in Germany are taken over by the partners as much as possible. BDF, being well experienced in project leadership and coordination, will take over the management and coordination of the project. The project duration will be extended until December 31st this year, so plenty of time to fulfil the aims of the project: preparing students for internships and connecting them to the world of work.
