The Intetrain project is developing a
methodology for training in the

What is the Intetrain project ?

The Intetrain project is developing a toolkit comprising a blended suite of e-Learning modules, practical tests, online self-assessments and supporting manuals.

This toolkit is targeted at operators, trainers and managerial staff working in SMEs (Small and Medium-sized Enterprises) in the machinery and equipment manufacturing sector.

We are looking at manufacturing processes and their associated hazards. For each hazard, we are defining the causes, consequences and actions that the operator should take to avoid the hazard.

We will be describing ways of minimizing the risks and providing illustrations of best practice within the toolkit.

How will the toolkit work?

The Intetrain project team is creating the training modules using Intetracker, an integrated authoring and learning management tool developed during the project. Machine operators will log on via the internet to take the training modules. They will be presented with a series of training slides followed by a short test that provides immediate feedback on their performance.

Trainers and managers will be able to enter their staff details into an online database and then select which training modules are appropriate to each operator. They can then monitor and evaluate the results of test taken by their staff and have an auditable record of who has completed which training modules. The toolkit will be available in four languages.

What sectors are targeted?

We are targeting the machinery and equipment manufacturing sector because:

- the workplace related risks are complex and frequently involve mechanical and chemical risks
- there are many environmental regulations - for example paint shops, hazardous and non-hazardous wastes, storage, handling of acids and organic solvents.
- the quality assurance requirements are stringent

What is the content?

Content will be based on common EU regulations, industry standards and best training practice and will provide training covering all legal requirements. We are covering both general and process specific requirements in:

- occupational health and safety
- fire prevention
- environmental sound practices
- quality assurance
