



**Traffic instructors** are in crucial responsibility as they teach the present and future traffic users to control their vehicles and observe the traffic regulations. In addition to these basic tasks, the professional responsibilities of traffic instructors include teaching the public about safe and responsible conduct in traffic. This concerns not only those vying for driver's license, but people in all age groups and in all paths of life.

**The central task** of traffic instructors is to affect their students in a way that they adopt a safe way of behaving in traffic – so that they consider other traffic users in addition to themselves and follow the principles of sustainable development. In essence, we aim to train responsible traffic users. Parents are similarly responsible for setting an example and teaching the next generation to be responsible traffic users.

**Traffic instructors** have a larger student base than they used to: in addition to driving school students and students in vocational education, they also teach children in kindergartens, school

children, moped drivers as well as adult professional drivers looking for additional training.

**Modern traffic education** is individual and demands that the traffic instructor gets to know each student as an individual. Continuous self-development makes sure that the education follows the time and is based on experiences.

**Traffic teachers** face challenges that didn't exist 15 to 20 years ago. That's why they need to find and develop the pedagogic and didactic skills to face these challenges.
