

# Interactive Educational Material for Pediatric Bone Marrow Transplantation Nurses Web Portal

## INSTRUCTIONS FOR USERS

The web portal <http://www.bmtcare.com> has been constructed as an interactive e-training tool for the pediatric BMT nurses in order to provide them with online training opportunities including courses, case studies, self-measurement and evaluation tools and consequently contribute in the long-term to the improvement of patient care services and patient safety in the field of bone marrow transplantation. Although everyone can have limited access to the public area of the portal, hence view various sections such as samples of project material, project partners, authors who contributed to the scientific material, news and events, links to BMT centers and other related organizations in countries of project partners, registration is required to have access to the “members area” which contains the scientific material (articles, self-evaluation tests and forum) created by project partners, that serves the primary objective of the project.

### Becoming a Member:

Registration is simple and takes only a few steps. First select the language in which you prefer to view the portal material, then simply click the “Register” link on the left column, enter the information required for registration, click the “Submit” button and a confirmation message containing an activation link will be sent to your indicated e-mail address. Click the activation link in the e-mail or copy and paste the link into your browser’s address window to activate your membership. Now you can log-in to the “members area” by entering your user name and password.

### Members Area:

Now that you have logged-in to the portal, a new “user menu” will be visible on the left-hand-side of the screen. You can edit your details, access the e-learning section and the forum or log-out by clicking on one of the following links.

- Your Details
- E-Learning
- Forum
- Log-out

The “**E-Learning section**” contains the core educational material of the portal, i.e. the BMT Care Courses. When you enter this area, just click “yes” when you see the question generated by the system, “You are about to enrol yourself as a member of this course. Are you sure you wish to do this?” Once you are in, you can read the educational articles in five different languages. Some course topics even include videos with subtitles.

Also note the “Quizzes” link on the left-hand-side. Quizzes contain self-evaluation and measurement tests which enable the users to evaluate their professional knowledge on BMT practices. Click on the link which will take you to a page prompting you to click the “Question Bank” in five different languages. This will be followed by a new page mandating you to click the “Attempt quiz now” button.

Take the test to measure your professional knowledge. Note that there are three buttons at the bottom of the test page, namely “Save without Submitting”, “Submit Page” and “Submit all and Finish”. “Save without Submitting” button allows you to save the test up until the last question you have answered but does not submit your answers for scoring. You can still change your answers and answer further questions. “Submit Page” button submits your answers and scores them but still allows you to change your answers and answer further questions. “Submit all and Finish” button submits your answers for scoring but this time you cannot go back and change your answers or answer further questions. Note

that the page you will be prompted to marks your correct and incorrect answers and highlights the correct answer in green colour along with an explanation at the bottom of each question box in case your answer is incorrect.

Lastly, there is a forum area for the members, which comprises three sub-forums, namely "Nurse Café", "All Medical Personnel" and "Consult BMT Experts". "Nurse Café" is for discussion of BMT nurses only. All medical personnel including physicians, nurses and other BMT care personnel can interact with each other in the "All Medical Personnel" forum. "Consult BMT Experts" forum on the other hand is for individuals (patients, their families, medical students, etc.) who want to consult the BMT medical personnel on BMT-related issues and seek answers to their questions.
