FINAL PUBLIC DISSEMINATION CONFERENCE OF THE EL4VET PROJECT AT WOLVERHAMPTON

On 10th July 2012 the EL4VET project held its final conference involving all partners, who gave an overview of the project activities and products. The conference began with guest speaker, Joanna Michalak from the Department of Educational Studies at the University of Lodz, who gave an interesting presentation about emotional literacy and how it can be applied in education. Elke Nauheimer followed Joanna, a PhD student at the University of Wolverhampton who informed the audience about a project she worked on with City of Wolverhampton College regarding emotional literacy embedded in a training programme. All partners gave an overview of their experiences of the project and results from their EL4VET transfer sessions held in their own countries in their national language. A demonstration of the tools and materials developed and adapted during the project was also given, followed by an open forum where the audience and partners could discuss potential future opportunities for further work not only in the VET sector, but in other areas such as health care.
