1) VET-CERT - Competence Profiles



(translated from the original text of Manon Irmer, öibf)

As an important outcome of the VET-CERT project, öibf (Austrian Institute for Research on Vocational Training) has developed competence profiles for quality managers in the school-based VET sector in Austria in collaboration with numerous stakeholders. These quality managers are actors at institutional level (schools) and at system or provider level (provincial and federal level) who are active in the operational or strategic areas as part of QIBB.

The development of these competence profiles, as chosen by öibf, builds on Gianni Ghisla's CoRe model - a well established method of VET research for curriculum development. (see more at www.vet-cert.at/products/competence_profiles).

The competence profiles for

- > Principals,
- > School Quality Process Managers,
- > School Inspectorate,
- > Regional Quality Process Managers and
- > Federal Quality Process Managers

follow a common structure. The first four competence categories correspond to the different phases of the quality cycle (Plan-Do-Check-Act) (see the scheme). In addition, from phase 3 to phase 4 overlapping competences were defined during the development of the competence profiles, whereby the 8th category is seen solely for the actors on strategic level. The developed competence profiles form also

2. DO: Implementation of Q-measures and Q-projects
3. CHECK: Evaluation of Q-measures and Q-projects
4. ACT: Deduction and planning of measures from evaluation results; documentation
5. Information about QIBB and quality management
6. Motivation to carry out quality activities
7. Ensuring further and continuing training with QM focus
8. Setting up and organising structures of cooperation in the field of quality

2) VET-CERT Curricular Framework - Report from the Development Team

(translated from the original text of Jörg Markowitsch, 3s)



According to the work plan of the VET-CERT project, a curricular framework as well as a concept for a certification process is to be developed based on the VET-CERT competence profiles, on the Stocktaking Report and on the analysis of comparable training offers. For this purpose a special development team has been established. The members of the team represent project partner organisations, potential participants, teachers and providers (representatives of university colleges of teacher education, universities and adult education) of the future training program and representatives of the Federal Ministry for Education, Arts and Culture (BMUKK). The task of the development team is to provide support and guidance to the VET-CERT Team for the composition of the VET-CERT products Curricular Framework and Certification Concept. In addition, the development team will contribute to the quality assurance of the above mentioned product.

After the first work meeting where the key cornerstones for the curricular framework were defined, the first draft of the curricular framework is already at hand to be discussed in the third meeting of the development team. “We hadn’t expected that we would have so soon and such a sophisticated draft to be used for discussion in the team” commented Franz Gramlinger from ARQA-VET the ongoing process. Both final products, Curricular Framework and Certification Concept are seen to be available during the autumn of 2012.
