**2Fish dissemination statistics**

After more than 15 months of project activity here is an initial report on the promotion and dissemination activities of 2Fish:

- The website has attracted more than 700 visitors during 2012 from Italy, Denmark, Spain, Ireland, Norway, Belgium, Germany, Turkey, Portugal and the United Kingdom;
- Over 2000 web pages surfed with an average duration of about 4 minutes;
- 1000 leaflets printed and distributed to local stakeholders in all partner countries and at different events;
- 280 members on 2Fish Facebook group;
- Over 300 visitors to the 2Fish Facebook page;
- 35 followers on Twitter.

The results are very interesting and are expected to increase the visibility of the project during the testing phase of training courses.

**2Fish innovative training modules**

The 2Fish project partners have structured and approved the training modules that will be

tested in the coming months in the different partner countries. The following is a brief summary of the training courses:

**Business law concerning fishery related businesses**

The training module, structured in a single unit, is designed to enable candidates to gain knowledge and understanding of relevant legislation in running their businesses and the sources of law concerning the fisheries sector, understand the legal method of law and the most important rules of private international law and Procedural law, with reference to contract law, tort law, national and international sale of goods (CISG), contract drafting and credit agreements.

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**Introduction to developing a new seafood product**

The training module, structured in 5 units, is intended to provide an overview for developing a new seafood product and covers topics such as stage gate processes, market analysis and interpretation of information, feasibility studies and designing a project plan. The course guide the participants through setting up a lab scale trial to develop a prototype incorporating initial

sensory testing, microbiological analysis, packaging and recipe formulation and nutritional testing, to important factors when sourcing ingredients and packaging and when launching a new product and post-launch



review process.

**Quality management in seafood production**

The training module, structured in 2 units, is designed to enable candidates to gain knowledge and understanding of the quality management plan in seafood production, quality control, fish production chain, production process, packaging methods, personal hygiene and cleaning. The course will also cover relevant legislation, hygiene zones and the role of supervisors authorities in companies.

**Fishery tourism and boat carpentry**

The training module, structured in 4 units, is designed to enable

candidates to gain knowledge and understanding of the origin and evolution of fishing tourism and the situation of this activity at destination, the offers and demands in fishing tourism at a local level and how to take advantage of it, the management and quality assessment and the impacts of fishing tourism, the importance of boat carpentry and its relationship with fishing tourism.

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**Fundraising for the production development in the fisheries sector**

The training module, structured in 3 units, allows the transfer of knowledge and skills to identify opportunities for funding (public and private) and develop and manage projects for the fish production development, with particular reference to the fisheries enterprises. The training course is designed to enable candidates to anticipate and frame a development project for the fisheries sector, for build and design of a develop initiative or an application for funding.

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**Traceability of fishery products**

The training module, structured in 8 units, is designed to enable candidates to gain knowledge and understanding for the traceability system of fishery products: EU and National legislation, importance of the food traceability and their relation with HACCP, forward tracking (traceability from fisher to the final consumer), record/registration, systems of control, technologies for traceability.

**2Fish partners in Galicia**

The third partners meeting took place in Galicia (Spain) during the second week of March 2013.

Each training course was presented by the partner responsible for developing it. Succeeding each presentation the partners briefly expressed if they would be interested in testing the whole course or parts of it.

The training courses will be launched in the coming months to be completed by the end of October. The partners have approved the plan of the final conference which will take

place in February 2014 in Rimini, Italy.
