Summary of youth professionals Induction Programme


An Induction workshop was offered to 10 youth professionals, within the framework of the DLQ project. Both the induction workshop and the trainings were offered to the same group of people during the same week. The persons that participated in the induction were members of youth organisations and youth associations with extensive knowledge on youth-related issues.

On August 5, 2013 the induction workshop was delivered. The main aim of the workshop was to familiarise youth professionals with the main aims and objectives of the project, as well as with the field of digital media and the relevant equipment. Participants then went on to complete the youth professionals training from August 6 to August 8, 2013. youth professionals received training based on the three modules developed.

Comments/Feedback:

Overall, the participants enjoyed the induction workshop and they also placed particular emphasis on the fact that this is a very innovative way to reengage young people who have dropped out of school, or face difficulties at school. However, most of them noted that the ACT Curriculum is rather extensive but they were satisfied by the fact that they have the flexibility to adjust it to the needs of their students.
