### **Summary of Dissemination Workshop: Meeting Outcomes**

CARDET held the first dissemination workshop related to the Digital Latin Quarter (DLQ) project on February 29, 2012. The workshop was attended by relevant stakeholders, including educators, representatives of the Ministry of Education and Culture, associates of second-chance education opportunities in Cyprus, relevant NGO representatives, and youth worker representatives.

After a welcome note by CARDET's Director, all participants were invited to introduce themselves and the organisations/services that they represented. A standard presentation regarding the Digital Latin Quarter followed, presenting in detail the scope and the main aims and objectives of the project, as well as explaining the roles and responsibilities that the participants would be expected to undertake. Project leaflets were also provided and the project's synergy display was present in the room. In addition, some background information regarding the project's consortium was given. The participants were then asked to discuss in small groups DLQ's potential in the Cypriot context, as well as its short-term and long-term applications in their fields/areas of service, and then a whole-group discussion followed. There was an overall positive approach to the project's goals and outcomes and the participants showed extreme interest in engaging in the project's activities.

The discussion was followed by a series of questions raised by the workshop participants on issues pertaining to mostly practical concerns, in terms of how youth



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workers and youth-at-risk would be chosen in order to participate in the project and how much time the participants would need to dedicate to the project.

After the end of the question-and-answer session, tea/coffee and snacks were served and participants had the chance to socialise and discuss further on the project. The event ended with CARDET's representatives thanking everyone for their participation and time and with the participants reiterating their support for Digital Latin Quarter.

### Comments/Feedback:

Generally, there was a very warm welcome to the project and all the participants acknowledged the importance of the aims and objectives addressed by it and the opportunity that is opened up by this project for the target groups and other beneficiaries. It should also be noted that a couple of the participants demonstrated willingness to engage in the project by becoming members of the Research Control Groups, but most importantly stakeholders agreed to bring us in contact with individuals that could potentially become members of the Research Control Groups that should be formed within the framework of the DLQ project.
